The contractors mulched the tree and it will be used around our school gardens. An audit of trees of concern in our grounds has been undertaken, with recommendations provided in a Tree Smart Report.

Prep

A BIG welcome back Prep students, families and carers for another great school term here at Two Mile! Mrs Nalder is enjoying her extended leave and is sure to have some adventurous tales to share on her return in Week 3. Until then, teaching and learning is back in full swing with Mrs Z and Mrs Boaden. We have welcomed a new student to our class, Gabe, and tagging along with Mrs Boaden is her pet dragon Punchinello. We get to add a feather to 'Punch's' nest each time we are caught following our school values of being responsible, respectful and safe learners. You should see his nest! In Literacy we are comparing imaginative and information text types, continuing to build our spelling and reading skills and fine tuning our handwriting. Class 1/2 CM

Welcome back to another busy term in Year 1/2. We started off the term welcoming some new friends to our classroom, and they have settled in nicely to our routines and structures. We have a very busy term of learning ahead, with reporting to be completed by the end of the term. In English, we are learning about informative texts. Students have come up with a definition about what these are and compared them to the wonderful narratives we wrote last term. They have become very good at picking the difference between story books and factual, informative texts.

This term in Math we are focusing on addition and subtraction techniques. We are also continuing with our partitioning to help with addition strategies. Another topic we are focusing on is calendars and time. If you have a calendar at home, or even an electronic calendar, show your children and have them add events to the calendar. Also, have a chat to them about how long things take. This will lead them into learning about time.

In Science we started our new unit on materials: "Mix, make and use". We investigated different objects, the materials used to make different things and their properties. The class enjoyed sorting the different objects into categories according to their materials and properties. It was interesting to see the conversations had with objects that could fit into different groups because of the materials used.

We had our first HASS lesson last week with a guest teacher in the classroom for the day. The class looked at directions, locations and labeling a map of familiar places. We look forward to exploring our inquiry question, "How are people connected to their place and other places?" Students are continuing to work with other teachers at our school for their Music, Health and PE, Technology and Dance. They will have some great work completed by the end of the term to show you from those subjects.

Along with our curriculum work, we have some exciting events planned for the term. This week is our ANZAC Day ceremony and march, and we look forward to our Gympie Show excursion later in the term. There will also be our rewards play for those students who meet the behaviour goals.


